## **Introduction:**

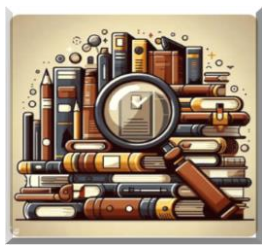

Furthermore, Kohn discusses the detrimental effects of grading and standardized testing on student motivation and learning. He advocates for alternative assessment methods



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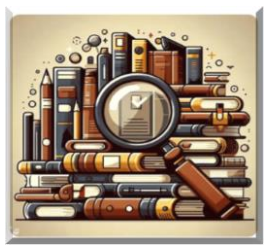
that focus on providing meaningful feedback and promoting growth rather than ranking and sorting students.

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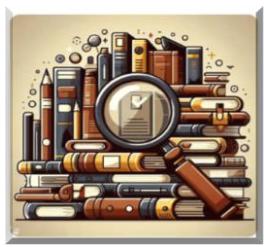
learning environment, educators can cultivate a sense of belonging and well-being among students, laying the foundation for positive behavior and academic success.
