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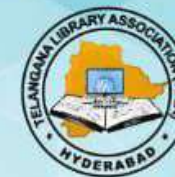

### About Theme of the Seminar

The present day world is witnessing an increased deterioration of morals and ethics in academic practices, especially in the developing countries. India is not an exception to it. There are multiple forms of academic misconduct or academic corruption, such as, fake degrees, degree mills, predatory journals, plagiarism, cheating in examinations & admissions. Over the years, these malpractices have proliferated to the extent of threatening the foundations of academic citadel and the society at large. However, Plagiarism—the most common form of misconduct in the academia— has reached an alarming stage requiring correction, as it is increasing with the technological advancements and the proliferation of digital information resources. “Plagiarism is the appropriation of another person's ideas, processes, results, or words without giving appropriate credit” (US Federal Policy on Research Misconduct).

Altbach(2015) states that according to the report of the Exams Ethics Project, a non-governmental organization working in Nigeria, academic fraud and corruption is a “big business” in that country, resulted in revoking of over 7,000 degrees by the University of Port Harcourt in Southern Nigeria.

Ignorance and lack of awareness of the principles and guidelines relating to the culture of academic integrity are considered to be the reasons for spreading of plagiarism instances. It is suggested that an organized and multifaceted national campaign is needed to root out the academic corruption by sensitizing the academics such as, faculty, research scholars, students, and the society at large. The present Seminar is a step in the direction of creating awareness on the above issues.

In India, UGC made it mandatory for all the researchers in the universities across the country to subject their thesis to plagiarism detection software for verification before their theses are sent for evaluation. INFLIBNET is providing free plagiarism software (Urkund) to universities, and Turnitin is the largely used anti-plagiarism detection software. Further, UGC has brought UGC Regulations, 2018 on 'Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions' to combat with plagiarism and recommended that the thesis should not have more than 10% of similarity with the earlier works and for cases beyond, it made various suggestions for improvement and punishment too.

### About IIMC

In the year 1973, a few concerned farsighted well-meaning minds were in a huddle to establish Business Management course in collaboration with Pittsburgh University, but the action plan was thrashed out. In this state of perplexity, founders of Vasavi Seva Kendram and Vysya Hostel together conceived the idea of an academic wing and registered it as Vasavi Foundation, with men of letters as its members. They contemplated an institution of national character and christened it as “Indian Institute of Management and Commerce”. During this time the Department of Commerce, Osmania University was trying to improve B.Com. Undergraduate course focusing on Law, Accounts, Economics and bring in Mathematics by introducing “B.Com(Hons.)”, a three year course.

We offer Honors, General, Computers, Computer Applications, BBA and B.Sc. Courses in almost all the major subjects from the science and Commerce streams. The teaching-learning programs are marked with personal mentoring; students are encouraged to work in teams and learn from peers.
